Pharmacokinetics:

Pharmacokinetically the active ingredients, when present in a dosage form such as a lozenge, will exert their desired effect locally on the oropharynx.

Vocasept Throat Lozenges contain active ingredients, amylmetacresol, 2,4 dichlorobenzyl alcohol. Amylmetacresol and 2,4 dichlorobenzyl alcohol are mild antiseptics, which kill the bacteria associated with mouth and throat infections.

The action of sucking the lozenge allows the active ingredients to work in the area of the discomfort and also helps lubricate and soothe the painful area. This helps relieve the soreness and discomfort of mouth and throat infections.

No clinically significant interactions are known.

Indications:

For the symptomatic relief of sore throats, coughs and colds.

Contraindications:

Hypersensitivity to any of the ingredients.

Use in Pregnancy and Lactation:

There is no data to contraindicate the use of the active ingredients or menthol during pregnancy.

Precautions and Warnings:

Keep all medicines out of the reach of children.

If symptoms persist consult your doctor.

Patients with rare hereditary problems of fructose intolerance, glucose-lactose mal absorption or sucrose-is maltose insufficiency should not take this medicine.

Adverse effects:

Occasional hypersensitivity reactions.

Dosage and administration:

Vocasept Lozenges are suitable for Adults and Children over 6 years of age.

For oral administration.

Adults and children (over 6 years old):

One lozenge to be dissolved slowly in the mouth every 2-3 hours up to a maximum of 12 lozenges in 24 hours.

Not suitable for children under 6 years.

Elderly: There is no need for dosage reduction in the elderly.

Over dosage:

Overdose due to menthol is very unlikely unless the product is grossly abused. Overdose may cause irritation of the urinary tract and aggravation of pre-existing inflammatory conditions. Severe poisoning may cause the CNS to be depressed, leading to stupor and respiratory failure, or leading to excitement and convulsions.

In acute poisoning the stomach may be emptied by aspiration and lavage. Give a saline purgative such as sodium sulphate, 30 g in 250 ml of water, unless catharsis is already present. Demulcent drinks may be given and large volumes of fluid should be given, provided renal function is adequate.

Packing:- 1 x 12's and 2 x 12's

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Blister pack of 12 lozenges, Such 1 blister of 12 lozenges for 1x12 and 2 blisters of 12 lozenges for 2x12 are packed in a printed carton along with pack insert.

Shelf life:- 36 months from the date of manufacturing.

Storage Condition:-

Store below 30^oC.
